File Timestamps

Every file on Linux has three timestamps:

- **1.** The access timestamp or atime is the last time the file was read (Is -lu)
- The modified timestamp or mtime is the last time the contents of the file was modified (Is -I, Is -It)
- **3.** The changed timestamp ctime is the last time when some metadata related to the file was changed (ls -lc)
